- Power sector reforms during the nineties
- The basic approach involved:
 - Independent regulatory agency,
 - Unbundling the vertically and horizontally integrated utilities into generation, transmission and distribution.
 - Privatization of the unbundled utilities.
- In 2006, the World Bank prepared a systemic analysis of the impact of privatization on distribution of electricity sector⁽¹⁾. The graphs in this presentation has been taken from that source.
- It included 116 electric utilities in 10 Latin American countries.




